

Wood

is a live material. Even after being cut, it keeps breathing, radiating warmth and emitting resin aromas. Wood deepens your perception of life through providing interaction between Man and Nature. Its structure exhibits the golden amber color of well-treated wood — its luminosity creating a positive atmosphere.

Wooden bathroom ware designed by Munich-born Markus Horner boasts a perfect surface which attracts attention and provokes the desire to touch. With no doubt our product can help turn any bathroom interior into something exquisite, extraordinary, striking and amazing.

Markus personally oversees every single step of production — from developing the design to applying the sealing varnish layer. Each object is made by gluing dozens of wooden rings to each other. When properly polished, the wood is thoroughly soaked in mordant solution and covered with at least 10 layers of special varnish. This varnish conforms to certain requirements and the Act of Foodstuffs and Commodities (Paragraph 35 and DIN EN 71), which is applicable to children's toys.

The next drying phase takes several weeks. The final stage involves applying NanoCover to produce a glossy waterproof surface which requires no special care. Nearly the entire production including a final shape cut requires a craftsman's skill, so the whole process takes 12 weeks.

Facing materials can be chosen from our wide selection of both ordinary and precious wood species. As a rule, a model frame bears a color tone to meet a client's unique preferences. All wash basins and all bathtubs feature a smart bath plug engraved with the designer's copyright logo and a product serial number in order to emphasize the exclusive concept behind each item. At a client's request, it is also possible to have the plug chrome surface engraved with the name of a villa, yacht etc. Our products come with a 10-year guarantee.





Taurus

Taurus wash basin is definitely the crown jewel of our exclusive collection. Width: 120 cm. All plumbing tubes in the basin bottom part are concealed and decorated by a round-shape cover plate to be made out of copper or stainless steel according to a client's choice. The upper surface is remarkably decorated with ammonite ornaments.

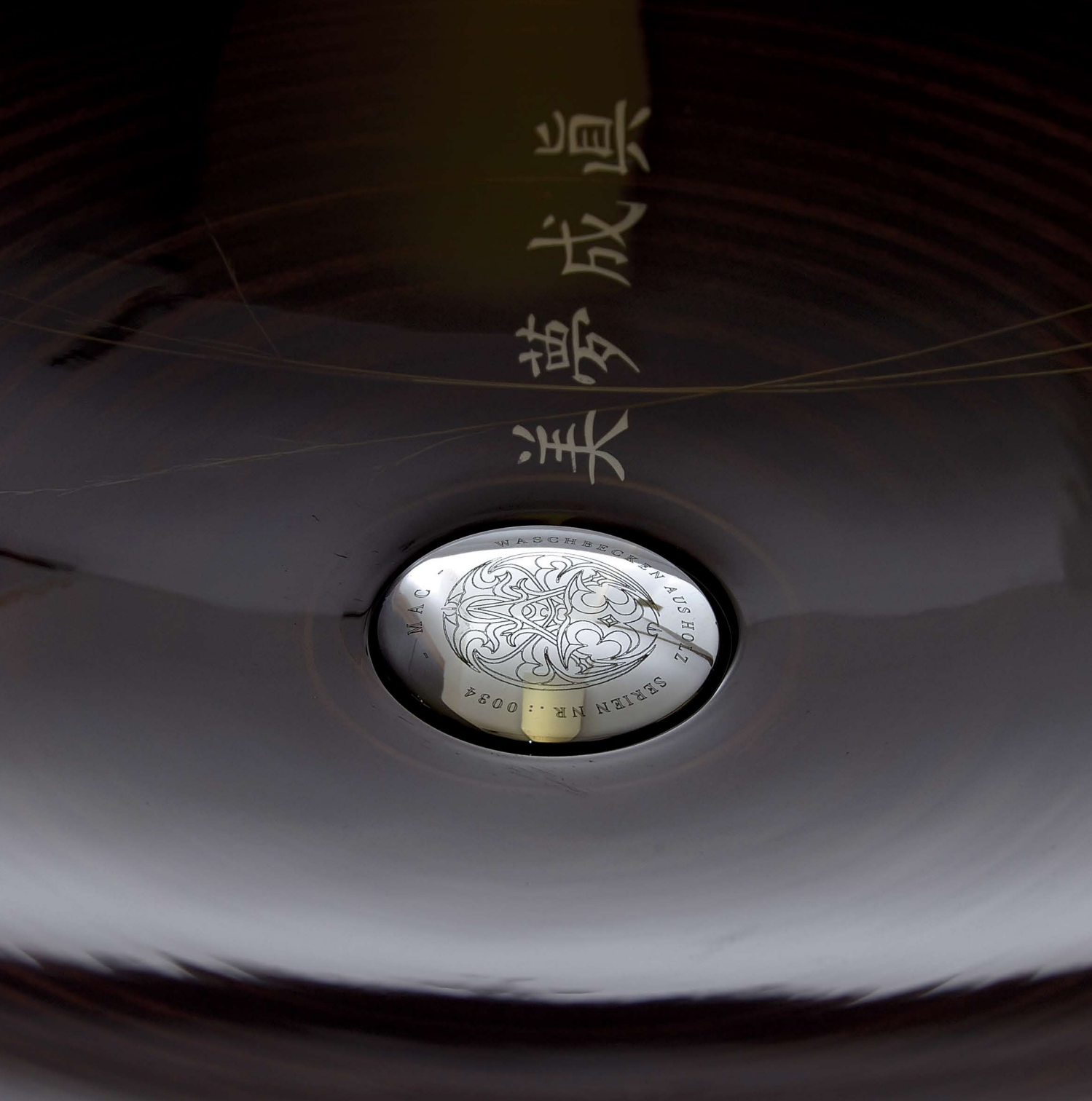
Production takes 8 weeks.

Aquila

The unusual shape of Aquila wash basin was inspired by water, sea and surf. The front basin edge is polished in a manner bearing resemblance to a breaking wave. The upper surface is remarkably decorated with ammonite ornaments.

Production takes 7 weeks.





Vela

Vela wash basin is light and elegant. It is only about 8 mm thick. This wash basin can be installed in a slab made out of wood, marble and other materials. Vela possible diameter is 40 or 45 cm, its height can amount to nearly 15 cm. Basins of a smaller diameter can be manufactured at a special order.

Production takes 5 weeks.

Vela Low

Vela Low wash basin is of the same diameter and wall thickness as Vela, but its height is only 9 cm. The wash basin can also feature stylized Chinese motifs with dried plants inserted in varnish layers.

Production takes 5 weeks.





Centaurus

Centaurus is a high class corner-bathtub tailored and adapted for natural forms of the human body. A comfortable shape and protruding elbow-rests help you relax and feel cozy in the best possible way. The upper surface is remarkably decorated with ammonite ornaments.

Production takes 12 weeks.

Bootes

The shape of Bootes bathtub resembles a boat hull. Its size and design will not leave you indifferent. Length from edge to edge is 260 cm, width — 130 cm, height — 65 cm.

Ammonites

are the most ancient relatives of today's cephalopods, for example squids and octopuses. Their soft body was enclosed into a spiral-shaped shell. The first ammonites appeared on Earth 400 million years ago. They chose gorgeous 'clothes' for themselves and spent another three hundred million years showing off and trying to outdo each other by adding new decorations to their shells. Ammonites ceased to exist about 65–70 million years ago and disappeared along with dinosaurs. The wind did not sweep away their story however, instead, every shell we pick up preserves their memory, taking us back to the past.
